HISTORY OF HAYMARKET CENTER

The heroic mission of Haymarket's founder Monsignor Ignatius McDermott dates back to the 1930s when he started helping homeless individuals with drug and alcohol use disorders living along West Madison Street in Chicago. Our founder worked to educate lawmakers about the disease of addiction, and in 1975 lawmakers agreed to decriminalize public intoxication opening the way for treatment. In the same year, Monsignor McDermott in partnership with Dr. James West opened Chicago's first social setting detoxification unit (originally called Haymarket House) where homeless individuals with substance use disorders could enter 24 hours a day. Haymarket House was named for its proximity to Haymarket Square, where in 1886 a clash between striking workers and police brought a change in society's attitude toward the working poor. Similarly, Haymarket's mission was to bring about a change in the public's perception of alcoholism and drug addiction as a disease from which recovery is possible.

Today, Haymarket Center has grown to become Chicago's largest provider of treatment for substance use disorders with over 30 clinical programs delivered through a six-story, three building complex located in the Near West Side of Chicago.

Men's Residential Treatment

- Variable length of stay treatment program
- Treatment and aftercare planning to address men's issues
- Evidence-based group and individual therapy
- Self-help, health and wellness and relapse prevention groups
- Recovery coaching

Men's Rapid Stabilization Program

- Short-term for individuals who completed residential treatment
- Treatment and aftercare planning to address relapse issues
- Evidence-based group and individual therapy
- Health education and self-help groups

Men's Transition Toward Recovery

- Medication assisted treatment for opiate addictions
- Treatment and aftercare planning to address opiate use
- Evidence-based group and individual therapy
- Medication observation
- Self-help, HIV/STI and hepatitis education, recovery coaching

Men's Integrated Treatment

- Co-occurring substance use & mental health treatment program
- Integrated treatment and aftercare planning
- Evidence-based group and individual therapy
- Medication observation and psychiatric support
- Self-help groups, health education, case management

Integrated Care Program

- Stabilization of acute substance use and mental health disorders
- Medication observation and psychiatric support
- Treatment and aftercare planning with referrals
- Individual and group mental health & substance use counseling

All patients are connected with a benefits specialist who helps them determine a method of payment. Haymarket accepts Medicaid and most insurance plans with payment options for the uninsured.

All patients have access to on-site primary care, mental health care, case management, self-help groups and trauma counseling.

- Family recovery coaching

MATER Hall Program

- Postpartum women with children ages 0-5 years
- Postnatal care, pediatric care, daycare, parenting classes
- Treatment and aftercare planning for mother and child
- Groups and individual therapy, family recovery coaching

MOMs Program

- Comprehensive treatment for pregnant women with correctional involvement
